As a Family Physician I am one who thinks, and also does. Clinical teaching and learning has always been paramount, and starts with what happens with each patient in the exam room. It has stretched to encompass taking this dictum trans-Atlantic in the third year of my Family Medicine residency, instructing and caring for 600 New York Maritime Academy students as Ship Physician—and in the fourth decade of my career to taking care of United States military veterans for the Veterans Health Administration.

A Family Physician takes all comers, and I have welcomed challenges outside the exam room. Early in my career I held New York and Massachusetts state Family Practice association offices as well as nationally with the American Academy of Family Physicians; I remain committed to keeping Family Medicine the cornerstone of American healthcare excellence.

A Family Physician thinks ahead. I joined The Fallon Clinic, a 250 physician multi-specialty group with a federally qualified HMO, and soon recruited 14 colleagues to establish new Family Practice departments at both Fallon and its affiliated hospital, St. Vincent. This won an award for healthcare innovation, was done in the super-specialized shadow of "Harvard Medicine", and laid the groundwork for a new Family Medicine residency.

My work as a Family Physician requires reaching toward the "new" and the "best", skills that also are critical in continuing to teach both medical students and residents. I have been privileged to pass along the classic approach to the patient that was given to me by my professors; deeply understanding basic principles allows one to imagine and move with gusto to what is needed next.

My career as a Family Physician has brought me through all the major healthcare delivery systems in the United States: solo practice/academic /large multi-specialty groups/community health/and military treatment facilities. A still strong core interest in continuing to do the work of medicine well has dovetailed with the extensive experience I have in designing and implementing Quality Assurance/Improvement, Clinical Audit, and Risk Management programs, and in helping fellow physicians see the integral daily use of these principles.

In the human being who becomes a doctor of any stripe, excellence in communication begins with putting people at ease so they can tell their stories. This begets excellence in diagnosis and

care, the best, elegant use of human and technical resources, and means that both patient and physician can once again "enjoy" the medical moments. I believe it is a rational dream to see myself working with others who can envision and produce a scientific marvel of a healthcare system that beats from the heart of medicine.
